# Study Notes for 2 Timothy 2: 14-26

#### **Verse 14** -

- The Apostle told Timothy to keep reminding the people of what they had been taught. Why do you think people need reminders so often?
- What are some of the things you personally need to be reminded about?
- Paul also told Timothy to **charge** the people about arguing over words. What do you suppose a charge (solemn warning) would sound like? How would you expect a pastor to do that?
- Why do you think people become so fixated on words to the point that they become a point of arguments?

# **Verse 15** -

- Timothy was told to present Himself to God in three ways in this verse. Point out all three.
  - 1. A workman approved by God
  - 2. Someone who needs not be ashamed
  - 3. Someone who rightly handles the Word of God
- How does someone know if they've been approved by God?
- What would cause a pastor/teacher/leader to be ashamed?
- What does it mean to rightly handle (divide) the Word of God?
- How do you know if the Word is being properly handled?
- What are the dangers of the Word being mishandled?

#### Verse 16-19 -

- Paul refers in these verses to "irreverent babble" The New American Standard Bible renders this as "worldly and empty chatter." Give some examples of this kind of talk that might be heard today?
- How does this kind of talk "lead people into more and more ungodliness"?
- What can you do to avoid it?
- Paul tells Timothy of two men who have "**swerved from the truth**." What does it mean to "swerve from the truth" and what can you do to avoid it?

#### Verse 20-21 -

What is the purpose of this word-picture? What is Paul telling Timothy?

## Verse 22

- If someone told you to "**flee youthful passions**" without giving you any insight into those passions, what kind of things would you assume they were referring to?
- How exactly does someone "pursue righteousness, faith, love, and peace"?

## **Verses 23-26**

- Why do you think people fall into quarreling so easily?
- If you were exhorted today to avoid "foolish, ignorant controversies" what kinds of things today fall into those categories?
- Why do you think it's important for a Pastor and Church Leader to not be quarrelsome?
- In verses 24-25 Paul lists 4 things that Timothy (and Pastors) should strive for whenever people become contentious. Name all four.
- Is there one of these four things that seems most important to you?
- Verse 26 suggests that giving into quarreling and being contentious is one way we can actually cooperate with the enemy's agenda. What should a believer do when he or she realizes this is what they've been doing?
