Read 4: 21-31

- Paul begins this section with a question for those who are considering leaving the Gospel to be under the Law. He asks if those people have ever actually read the Law. Taking Galatians
 3:10 into consideration, what is Paul actually asking them?
- How does law-keeping resemble slavery?
- What does Abraham sending Hagar and Ishmael away illustrate for us?
- What do Hagar and Sarah represent for us? (See :24-27)
 - Which covenant does Hagar represent? Why?
 - Which covenant does Sarah represent? Why?
- Ishmael and Isaac represent the offspring of the two covenants? What does each reveal to us?
- In **verse 28** Paul writes that all believers are "**children of promise**." What does he mean by that?
- What does **verse 29** tell us about what we can expect from those who are not children of God?
- Read Romans 3:19-22 and discuss how these verses connect with Galatians 4 and our study.
- What was the most important thing you learned from this study?
