## Study questions for John 1 (Part 2):6-18

- The author gives an overview of the ministry of John the Baptist. Read **Luke 7:29**. What was the key to John's success in preparing the hearts of people to hear Jesus?
- What does it say about Jesus when John refers to Him as "the light"? How about "the TRUE light"?
- What are verses 10 and 11 trying to communicate to us about our ability as humans to know God?
- Verse 12 gives a wonderful promise. What is it?
- In what sense is becoming a child of God a matter of a person's will (see 1:12)?
- **Verse 13** emphasizes that our birth as children of God is not natural. Why do you think John stressed this point as much as he did?
- How could you use **verses 12 and 13** to respond to someone who said, "I was born into a Christian family" as the reason for why they now believed themselves to be a Christian?
- **Something to Ponder**: We don't really use the phrase "**believed in his name**" anymore but in ancient times, someone's name represented the essence of their character. To believe "on the name" (literally) of Jesus means to trust who He is.
- When John wrote, *the Word became flesh*; he is telling us in graphic language that Jesus was fully man. Why is that important?
- Compare 1:1 to 1:14. Who is the Word "with" in each verse and what is incredible about this shift?
- Christians use the phrase "the Word of God" to refer to both Jesus and the Bible. In what sense are they both the logos, and in what sense must we carefully distinguish between them?
- What would you say to someone who told you that to remain saved Christians must successfully keep the Ten Commandments? What Scripture passages would you use to respond?
- Why is verse 18 a good one for proving the deity of Jesus Christ? How could you use it when responding to someone who wasn't sure?
