Study Notes for John 6: (Part 2):16-21

- Begin by reading through John 6: 16-21
- Next, read through Matthew 14:22–33
- Finally, read through Mark 6:45-52
- What are the major differences between the three accounts?
- What are the primary similarities?
- What are the benefits of having this account given to us by three different authors?
- What does Jesus reveal about Himself in John 6:16–21?
- We see from this passage that God will at times allow storms to rage in the very area in which He called us. What do you think some Christians struggle with believing that God would allow storms to come our way?
- What benefit have you seen from the storms the Lord has allowed in your life?
- What does this account of the storm have in common with the challenge Jesus gave earlier to the disciples to feed the hungry crowd in 6:5?
- In the final verses of the passage we learn that the disciples did the following:
 - 1. They recognized that Jesus had dominion over the storm
 - 2. They were glad to take him into the boat,
 - 3. They found that the task Jesus had given them to do was now supernaturally completed.
- How do these three points help us to understand how to respond to the storms that come our way?
